Sayın Üyemiz,

Gemi Brokerleri ve Acenteleri Ulusal Birlikleri Federasyonu'ndan (The Federation of National Associations of Ship Brokers and Agents – FONASBA) alınan 10.09.2020 tarihli Ek'te sunulan e-posta yazısında, Avrupa Birliği Genel Müdürlüğü'nün (European Union Directorate General) resmi sayfasında Smart Borders girişiminin bir parçası olarak yeni Giriş-Çıkış Sisteminin (Entry/Exist System –EES) yer aldığı bildirilmektedir.

Söz konusu yeni sistemin, kısa dönem vizeye (short – stay visa holders) ve vize muafiyetine sahip üçüncü ülkelerden Avrupa Birliği (European Union-EU) sınırlarına seyahat eden kayıtlı yolcular için otomatikleştirilmiş bir bilişim teknoloji (Information Technology – IT) sistemi olduğu ifade edilmektedir. Yeni sistemin yolcunun kimliği ve parmak izi ve yüz görüntüsü dahil olmak üzere biyometrik verilerinin üç yıl boyunca toplanarak, uygun bir yolcunun AB dışından her geçişinde pasaport damgalama ihtiyacını ortadan kaldırmasını amaçladığı bildirilmektedir.

FONASBA tarafından gönderilen 21.09.2020 tarihli Ek'te sunulan e-posta yazısında ise, Avrupa Topluluğu Brokerler ve Acenteler Birliği(ECASBA)ECASBA üyelerinin yeni "Giriş/Çıkış Sistemi (ESS)" hususunda kendi ulusal göç idareleri ile iletişime geçmelerine yönelik talebin ifade edildiği belirtilmektedir.

Yazıda devamla, bahse konu sistemin tüm Schengen Bölgesi olmayan ülkeleri kapsayacağı ifade edilmekte olup, hibrid elektronik pasaport (hybrid e-passport)ve biyometrik veri sistemine geçişi ve bu sayede söz konusu sistemin damgalı pasaportların yerini almasının amaçladığı belirtilmektedir. Söz konusu uygulamaya 2022 yılının ilk yarısında başlanmasının beklendiği ifade edilmektedir.

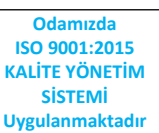

Dear All,

Some ECASBA member associations will be aware of the development of the new EES system (part of the Smart Borders initiative) which is described on the DG-HOME website as “an automated IT system for registering travellers from third-countries, both short-stay visa holders and visa exempt travellers, each time they cross an EU external border”. The intention is that the new system will collect and retain (for three years) the passenger’s identity and biometric data (fingerprints and facial images) and at the same time remove the need for passports to be stamped every time an eligible passenger crossed an EU external border. Further information on the EES can be found on the DG-HOME website at: ec.europa.eu/home-affairs/what-we-do/policies/borders-and-visas/smart-borders/ees_en Implementation of the project is currently anticipated in February 2022.

For ECASBA members, one of the issues will be how the system copes with crew changes, and particularly those seafarers from third countries travelling on a Seaman’s Book. ECASBA will therefore be liaising with ECSA and DG-HOME on this question (and others that may also arise) and to assist us in this regard we would be grateful to hear from any ECASBA members that are currently in discussion with their national immigration/nationality authorities on this project (our Dutch colleagues already are) and if any other issues have arisen as a result of those discussions. Early indications from the discussions in the Netherlands indicate that the new entry formalities may (initially at least) take longer than at present.

Thanks in advance for your input and rest assured we will keep you updated on the progress of this project.

Dear All,

On behalf of ECASBA Chair Marco Tak, we are writing to ask if any ECASBA member associations have been in contact with their national immigration authorities in relation to the new "Entry/Exit System (ESS)" that is currently under development by DG-HOME as part of the wider euLISA project. A fact sheet is attached and further details can be found here:

In short, this system will cover all non-Schengen area nationals and is intended to introduce a hybrid e-passport and biometric data and to fully replace stamps in passports. Introduction is expected to be in the first half of 2022.

The use of electronic passport information and biometric data raises several issues, not least how does it handle applicable travellers without electronic passports and of particular interest to ECASBA members, how Seamen's Books will be handled.

We will be discussing this with ECSA but at the same time it would be useful to ascertain what questions have been raised by national associations (and possibly responses given!) so that we can feed those into our discussions with DG-HOME. Even if you have not yet raised any concerns at local level, we would be pleased to hear of any issues you foresee arising from the proposed introduction of ESS in your Member State.

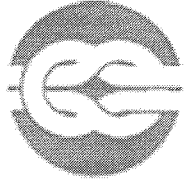

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

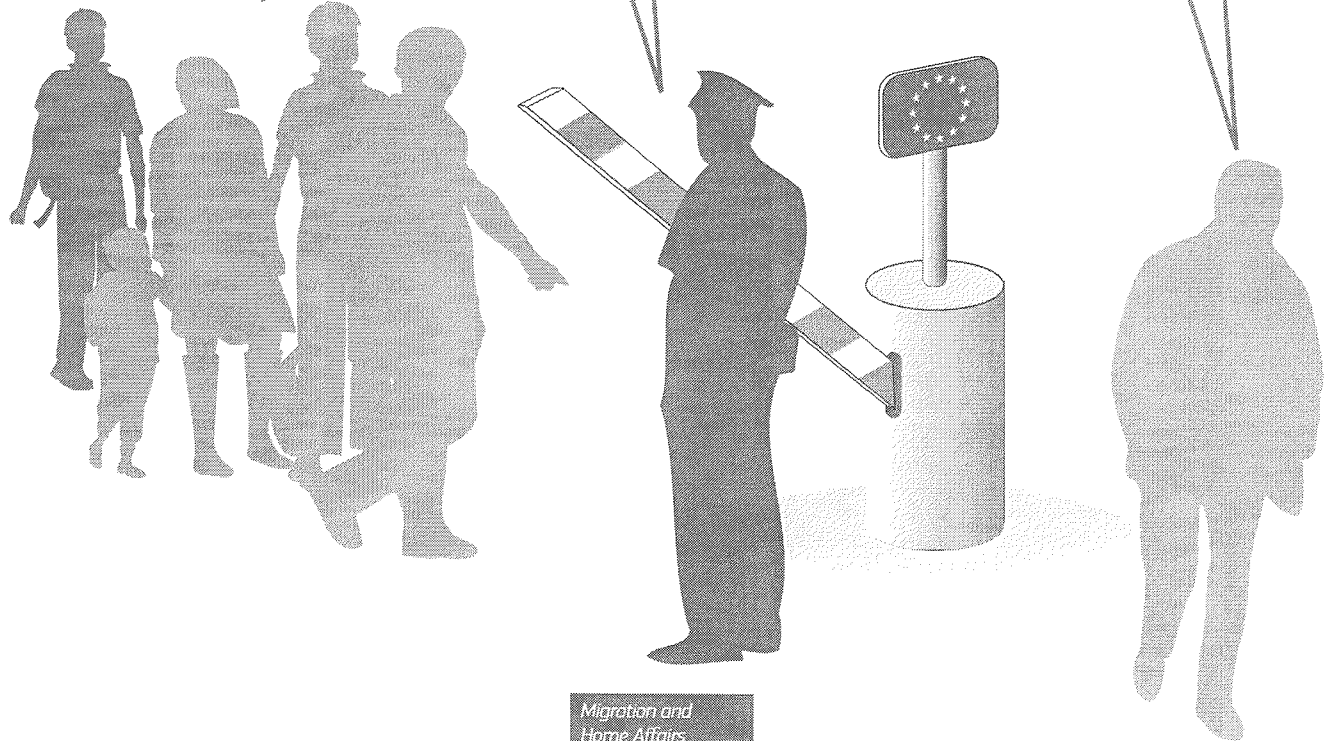

The Entry-Exit System

The Commission has proposed the establishment of an Entry-Exit System (EES) to:

-  Contribute to the modernisation of the external border management by improving the quality and efficiency of the external border controls of the Schengen Area
-  Reinforce internal security and the fight against terrorism and serious crime.
-  Help Member States dealing with ever increasing number of travellers to the EU without having to increase the number of border guards
-  Systematically identify over-stayers (individuals remaining in the Schengen Area after the end of their authorised stay)

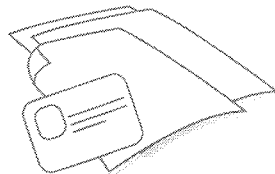

Expected outcomes of EES

It will provide:

- Precise information in a rapid and automated way to border guards during border checks;
- Information to border guards on refusals of entry of non-EU nationals and enable refusals of entry to be checked electronically in the EES;
- Precise information to travellers on the maximum length of their authorised stay;
- Precise information on who is overstaying their authorised stay;
- Evidence-based support to visa policy.

As regards access for law enforcement purposes, the expected impact of the EES will be:

- Support the identification of terrorists, criminals as well as of suspects and victims of crime;
- Provide a record of travel histories of non-EU nationals including crime suspects, perpetrators or victims of crime. It would thus complement the information in the SIS.
